Living Life Under a Microscope: The Reality of Being a Public Official; Ethics, Transparency and Accountability

In this two-part, 2.75-hour program, Brandy Johnson, principal attorney with Governmental Law, LCC in Lincoln, will address a myriad of challenges public officials face, not the least of which is balancing their legal and ethical obligations.

2:00 - 3:30 p.m. – In the first segment of her presentation, Ms. Johnson will provide a clear understanding of the distinctions between the law and ethics, discuss "blind spots" that can hamper well-meaning public officials from acting legally and ethically, and share helpful suggestions for cultivating an ethical culture in county government. She next will focus on government transparency, including navigating open meetings laws and the challenges faced when balancing the public's right to know versus the need for confidentiality, as well as guidance for handling requests of outside public interest groups, public emails and the vast social media world.

3:45 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. – The second segment of Ms. Johnson's presentation will focus on accountability and the legal and other consequences of unethical and dysfunctional behavior, with an emphasis on overcoming "outlier" behavior and toxic internal work relationships, and considerations for reporting ethics issues. Ms. Johnson will conclude with a look at some actual fraud and ethics claims that have taken place in Nebraska counties, how they were discovered, legal outcomes and how they could have been prevented.
